On Wednesday December 16, 2009 two male subjects came to the back door of a residence in the 11900 block of Main St. The suspects told the home owner that they worked for the Public Works Department and they were working on frozen pipes in the area and they needed to check the pipes in the residence. The homeowner then let the men inside the house. The suspects kept one of the elderly homeowners occupied by having them turn on faucets to check for dye while the other suspect roamed around the house. The homeowners became suspicious and yelled at the suspects who then left the house.

The victims later called the Village of Huntley and were told that the suspects were not employees of the public works department and that no work was being done in the area.

The suspects left the house on foot in an unknown direction. Both suspects were described as male Hispanics between 5'5 and 5'7 medium build, clean shaven and in their late 20's. They were both wearing dark colored clothing. No vehicles were observed in the area at the time.

The Huntley Police Department would like to remind citizens to ask for identification before allowing anyone to enter their homes. Village of Huntley Employees carry identification badges and will provide the identification upon demand. Village of Huntley Employees should also be driving vehicles that are clearly marked as village vehicles. If residents are still unsure they should contact the police department.
