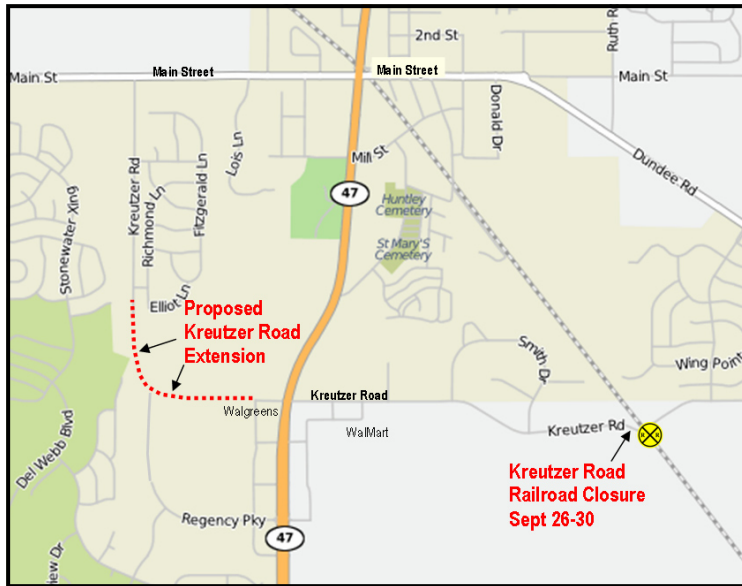

Kreutzer Road Closure

From September 26th through September 30th, the Union Pacific Railroad will be upgrading the railroad crossing at Kreutzer Road. **This project will require the Kreutzer Road crossing to be entirely shut down for 5 days (Sept 26th- 30th).** Notification signs will go up on Monday, September 19, 2011. Detour signs will go up several hours prior to closure and will remain posted throughout the process.

Kreutzer Road Extension Public Meeting Sept 20th

The Village is performing a Preliminary Engineering Study for the extension of Kreutzer Road from Illinois Route 47 to its existing terminus south of Main Street in the Village. The purpose of the meeting is to present the preferred improvement plan, the project schedule, and seek public input and comments regarding the project.

The meeting is scheduled for September 20, 2011, 5:00 P.M. to 7:00 P.M, and will be held at the Village of Huntley Municipal Complex, 10987 Main Street, Huntley, IL 60142.

All interested persons are invited to attend the open house public hearing for this project. The meeting will be accessible to those with disabilities. Anyone in need of special assistance and planning to attend should contact the Village before September 16, 2011 by telephone, in writing, or by e-mail.

The meeting will be conducted on an informal, open house basis. Representatives from the Village and the engineering consultant will be available to discuss the project and to answer questions on an individual basis.

Centegra Presses On For Huntley Hospital

Centegra recently met with the Illinois Health Facilities Services and Review Board (Review Board) for the first time to discuss their Centegra Hospital-Huntley application. Their application supported the need for a 128 bed hospital proposed to be located at the site of Centegra's Health Care Campus at Haligus and Reed roads.

As you may have heard, the Review Board issued an "Intent to Deny." Though not uncommon for a project of this size and scope, Centegra was disappointed that the materials they submitted in support of the project were not given further consideration. Over sixteen thousand area residents, their political leaders and community partners sent letters to the Review Board in support of the Centegra Hospital project in Huntley. Centegra is appealing the Board's decision and it is expected the hearing will be in October.
