Learn the history of Woodstock Street and celebrate the only remaining continuously bricked street in Huntley. This historic street is a remnant of Huntley's farming roots and the centerpiece of Huntley's first designated Historic District.

In 1916, the Huntley Village Board approved the brick paving of Woodstock Street providing farmers a convenient means to make the daily trip with horse and wagon to haul cans of milk to the train destined for Chicago. Route 47 did not go through town until 1936.
