## Back Flow Preventer Tests Available

A residential backflow preventer is a device that is designed to stop water from a home's fire suppression or lawn irrigation line from entering a home's drinkable water supply. Without a backflow preventer, a loss of water pressure could result in dangerous materials being siphoned into the drinking water.

The key to preventing contamination from entering your home's water supply is to have the backflow preventer tested annually. In fact, the annual testing of backflow devices is required by the Village, State and U.S. Environmental Protection Agency. An approved cross connection inspector is required to conduct the annual test using calibrated gauge equipment to ensure the device is working properly.

The Village Board has recently approved a program that allows residents to have their backflow preventers tested by the Village's Development Services Department for the cost of \$45 for one, and \$60 for both fire and lawn irrigation devices tested at the same address and on the same day. Please contact the Development Services Department at 847-515-5252 for more information or to schedule an appointment.

*\*It is not mandatory to use the Village of Huntley to perform the annual test, any Illinois Cross Connection Control Device Inspector that is registered with the Village can conduct the test.*

## Two Incumbents and One Newcomer Elected as Trustees

## Route 47 Widening

Year two of the Illinois Department of Transportation's (IDOT's) project to widen Route 47 is well underway. The project will widen the roadway to five lanes including a barrier median from Kreutzer Road on the south to Reed Road on the north. The project officially began April 5, 2010 and is scheduled to be completed in October 2011. The project will also include repairs to the curb, gutter and sidewalk in areas as needed.

## National Take Back Day Medication Disposal Event

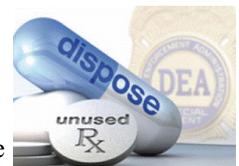

## Village Now Offers Online Bill-Pay

Many of our residents and businesses have asked us to consider offering an online option to charge payments. You can now use your MasterCard, American Express, or Discover card to pay for Water/Sewer Bills, Parking Ticket/Ordinance Violations, and Accounts Receivable Invoices. A rain date has been scheduled for Saturday, July 9<sup>th</sup>.

*Notice to residents: The Village of Huntley has a zero tolerance stance on illegal fireworks. Stay safe by keeping fireworks out of everyone's hands.*

## 50/50 Residential Parkway Tree Replacement Program 2011 (Non-EAB)

Residents may request an inspection of their parkway tree to see if it qualifies (trees must be dead or dying to qualify) for participation in the 50/50 Residential Parkway Tree Replacement Program.

Residents may call 847-515-5223 and leave their name and address and their tree will be inspected in June.

Once inspections are completed, residents will receive written notification of the inspection results. If the parkway tree qualifies for the program, they will receive an order form with a September 1st due date to participate in the fall 2011 planting. Plantings will take place late-September or early-October.

Residents may also replace the parkway tree on their own if they choose not to participate in the Village's program; however, no reimbursements will be made by the Village.

## EAB Infested Tree and Replacement Program

Residents that had infested Ash trees removed from their parkways as part of the 2010 EAB program will receive an order form to participate in the 2011 50/50 Residential Parkway Tree Replacement Program in May for a September planting.

Staff will inspect existing Ash trees in residential parkways for signs of infestation of the EAB. Residents that have Ash trees that are infested will receive written notification of the infestation and information about tree removal by the Public Works Department and an order form to participate in the 50/50 residential replacement program.

The process for removal and replacement is as follows:

- Village crews will cut down the infested tree, mulch it and dispose as warranted by the Illinois Department of Agriculture.
- If the tree is not being replaced, holes will be filled with dirt and seeded. Instructions will be provided on care for the seeded area.
- Residents participating in the 50/50 replacement program will be required to return the completed order form no later than July 1st in order to be given first priority of available trees.
- Residents may also replace the parkway tree on their own if they choose not to participate in the Village's program; however, no reimbursements will be made by the Village.

## Sidewalk Repair Rebate Program

As part of the 2011 Budget, the Village Board approved a new program to assist homeowners with the repair or replacement of public sidewalk. The Residential Sidewalk Repair Rebate Program allows residents to hire their own contractor to repair public sidewalks fronting their property and receive a rebate for repair costs up to a maximum amount of \$500. Rebate amounts are based on a flat rate of \$3.50 per square foot of sidewalk repaired (\$3.50 represents 50% of the estimated cost per square foot for concrete work). The program will be administered on a first-come, first-serve basis and is subject to limited funding availability at the time of building permit submittal. Repairs made to sidewalks on private property are not eligible for funding.

To qualify for a rebate under this program, the property owner must:

- Hire a contractor with a valid Village business registration
- Have the contractor obtain a permit from the Village prior to initiating any work. A rebate form completed by the property owner must accompany the permit submittal.
- Have the contractor complete the repairs in accordance with Village requirements and obtain final approval of the work by the Village as soon as completed but no later than October 31, 2011.

## Centegra Announces Plans for New Hospital in Huntley

In December 2010, Centegra Health System announced plans to build a 128-bed hospital at the Centegra campus in Huntley. The new hospital will bring access to healthcare for residents of southern McHenry County and northern Kane County, and local residents would have a state-of-the-art full-service hospital in the community.

The new hospital project will also have an impact on the local economy. Approximately 800 construction jobs are expected during the 30-month building schedule. Nearly 1,100 permanent jobs will be created after the hospital opens, including 700 clinical and 380 related jobs.

Before Centegra can build the hospital in Huntley they are required to obtain a Certificate of Need from the Illinois Health Facilities and Services Review Board (IHSRB). Centegra submitted their application for the Huntley hospital to the IHSRB in December. The Board is accepting comments from the public until June. Village approvals are also required for the project.

## Need a Building Permit?

If you are planning a home improvement project this year, please remember to check with the Development Services Department to see if a building permit is required.



Permits are required for many remodeling projects, repairs, replacements, new structures, and additions. The benefits of permitting the work include a plan review and inspection process to ensure that work is done to meet building codes and that contractors performing the work are registered and properly insured. It is also important to check with your Homeowner's Association prior to obtaining a permit, as most require review and approval before submitting a permit application to the Village.

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## Curbside Brush Pickup Week is May 2nd-6th

Brush pick up will take place from 7:00 am to 2:30 pm from May 2-6. Brush must be placed by the curb (crews will not go on private property to pick up brush).

The following will **NOT** be accepted:

- ◆ Tree limbs larger than 10" in diameter
- ◆ Tied bundles of brush
- ◆ Bagged material
- ◆ Leaves and yard waste

## How Do You Say it?

Have you ever stumbled when pronouncing a street name and wondered if you got it right? Many street names in Huntley are named after historical families who contributed to our rich Huntley heritage, and many have family members still living in the community. Below are two street names that many people have difficulty with, along with a helpful guide to assist you with the correct pronunciation.



**Kreutzer Road** (pronounced Kroyt'-zer) The Kreutzer family still lives on a farm located on Kreutzer Road near St. Mary's Church.

**Jim Dhamer Drive** (pronounced Day'-mer): The late James C. Dhamer was Mayor of Huntley from 1985 to 1999. His family still lives in town.
