Update - Bridge Closures Over I-90

As part of the Jane Addams Memorial Tollway (I-90) Rebuilding and Widening Project, the Illinois Tollway is rebuilding crossroad bridges that carry traffic over I-90 to accommodate the addition of new lanes on the Tollway.

As a result of the project, the following local bridges are now closed: Brier Hill Road, Sandwald Road, and Powers Road near Huntley.

Deer Path of Huntley Supportive Living

Deer Path of Huntley opened its doors to residents on August 23rd. The brand new residential community is comprised of a 128-unit, three-story building with 44 studio apartments and 84 one-bedroom apartments and serves physically disabled adults age 22 to 64.

BMA Properties manages and operates Deer Path through the Illinois Supportive Living program. Among the services offered are health monitoring and assistance with daily living activities. Medication reminders, housekeeping and laundry service, transportation and meals are included in the program.

Deer Path is located at 12500 Regency Parkway. An open house is scheduled for Saturday, September 21st between noon and 4:00 pm, where staff will give tours and those in attendance can learn more about the assisted lifestyle that is available to Deer Path residents.

Board Approves Preliminary PUD for Centegra Hospital-Huntley

During the August 22nd Village Board meeting, the Village Board unanimously recommended approval of the Centegra Hospital-Huntley's Preliminary PUD, Special Use Permit for a heliport, and Preliminary Plat of Subdivision. At the meeting, Centegra Health System officials presented detailed designs of the five-story, 128-bed Centegra Hospital-Huntley. The proposed site plan shows the new hospital building in the center of the existing Huntley Health Campus, located between Reed and Algonquin Roads and bordered by Haligus Road to the west.



According to Centegra Health System, the new hospital will offer advanced medical care ranging from preventive care to advanced surgical procedures. Some of the hospital's highlights include:

- 128 private rooms.
- A full-service Level II emergency department that includes an enclosed ambulance garage for patient privacy and a separate entrance for walk-in patients.
- A helipad to promote the rapid transfer of severely ill or injured patients.
- A medical office building that will provide more office space to physicians who will move to the community.
- Hospital units that have been carefully designed by the healthcare team including physicians, nurses and other staff members to ensure safety, privacy and efficiency.
- State-of-the-art surgical suites and diagnostic equipment.
- A 20-bed obstetrics unit and Level II nursery for babies who need special care.
- A new dining service that will include both indoor and outdoor seating.
- Close parking and a park-like feeling throughout the campus.

The next step will be for Centegra to present its Final PUD plans to the Plan Commission, followed by the Committee of the Whole, and ultimately the Village Board. Centegra hopes to break ground on the project in October and the hospital is expected to open in 2016.

Kreutzer Road Extension Update

In an effort to expedite the completion of the Kreutzer Road Extension Project, Kreutzer Road West (between Route 47 and Princeton Drive) will be completely closed for approximately 4 to 6 weeks. All businesses will remain open and are easily accessible via Princeton Drive. Please use alternate entrances along Route 47, directly south of the project.

This project involves the westward extension of Kreutzer Road from its current terminus at Princeton Drive and connecting it with the existing north-south portion of Kreutzer Road approximately 1/2-mile to the west (next to Lion's Chase Subdivision). This will result in an important connection in the roadway network to provide for east-west travel in the Village and will also allow for improved access to adjacent property. The new location will provide easy access for vehicular traffic for this popular recycling program.

Aldi's and Brunch Café Slated for Huntley

On September 9th, Interstate Partners presented a Concept Plan to the Plan Commission regarding the development of an Aldi's grocery store, and a Brunch Café restaurant in Regency Square Shopping Center located at the SW corner of Route 47 and Kreuzer Road. The development calls for the construction of two new commercial buildings immediately south of the newly built Starbucks, Rookies, Little Caesar's and Jimmy John's. A 6,560 square foot building with two (2) tenant spaces, one of which is listed to be occupied by Brunch Café. The local restaurant chain currently has locations in Roselle, Fox River Grove and McHenry and is open for breakfast and lunch only. A 16,340 square foot building to house Aldi's grocery store is also to be constructed. The official review of the project is currently scheduled to begin on September 23rd in front of the Plan Commission, and should proceed to the Village Board in October. The developer hopes to break ground this fall, and have the businesses open in spring 2014.



Curbside Branch Pick Up Dates Scheduled

The Huntley Public Works Department has scheduled its semi-annual curbside tree branch pickup for Village of Huntley residents. The dates for pickup are divided into 2 regions:

- **Week of September 30, 2013 - all roads north of Kreuzer Road**
- **Week of October 7, 2013 - all roads in Sun City**

Please place branches on the parkway by Monday morning during your collection week. Branch collection crews will only make one pass in each neighborhood.

Please note, the following will NOT be accepted: Tree limbs larger than 10" in diameter or smaller than 1/2" in diameter; Tied bundles of branches; Bagged material or material in cans; Leaves and yard waste; Trimmings from bushes; Evergreen material; Stumps of any kind.

Residents that miss the curbside pickup can make arrangements with their waste hauler, or a Saturday one time only drop off is scheduled for October 12, 2013 at Public Works located on Donald Drive from 8:00 a.m. to Noon.
